

Greek Drama the sole purpose of Greek Drama Club is for our students to present a play at Pansxoliki. Pansxoliki is held the end of January with locations rotating between north and south sides. Registration is a requirement so that all students must be available to participate and represent Koraes at this event. Registration is open to grades 3-8.

Math Tutoring - Students will be practicing math strategies and skills. Students will be engaging in math collaboratively with hands-on activities and problem solving. Students may also receive homework support.

Reading Tutoring - Students will be practicing reading strategies and skills at their level. Students will be engaging in text and meeting one on one with the teacher about their progress. Homework help will also be available!

Greek Tutoring: This group will meet once a week to support students who need additional help with Greek language.

Art Club: Art Club provides students with the opportunity to explore creative ideas and talents through projects and collaboration. There is a materials fee with this club.

Battle of the Books: Hey Middle Schoolers! Love to read? Battle of the Books is a voluntary reading program for students in grades 6 - 8. The purpose is simply to encourage students to read good books and have fun while competing with peers. Students will participate in games, discussions and other activities related to the 2019 Rebecca Caudill Titles. Students will read the Rebecca Caudill books and compete in trivia or Family Feud style questions about those books with an official Battle in the spring against another school.
