

Greek Dance Beginner: (3:35-4:05pm) No previous dance experience. Will learn basic Greek dances (Kalamatiano, Tsamiko, Hasaposerviko, Ypirotiko) Will need to be capable of dancing above dances in order to advance

Greek Dance Intermediate: (4:10-4:40pm) 1-2 years of Greek dance experience. Will learn more complicated Greek Dances (Balos, Ikariotikos, Kotsari, etc.) Will need to be capable of dancing all of the beginner dances in order to advance

Greek Dance Advanced: (4:45-5:15pm) 2-3 years of Greek dance experience (or good knowledge of Island & Mainland dances) Will learn various dances from different parts of Greece. Will need to be capable of dancing various Island & Mainland dances in order to advance to the performance group

Golf: This club will give students a chance to experience a sport that they may have never experienced before. They will learn some fundamentals and golf etiquette. Students will need to carpool to the golf course located a few miles away. Students may bring their own clubs or rent for \$10.

Lego and Building Club: Students will be creating Lego sculptures within their groups. Math, science, engineering skills and creativity will show what they have done!

Forensics Club: Students complete activities to solve crimes. They will start by completing a handwriting analysis, spotting the differences between scenes, and using the power of observation. These skills will be used to solve cases.

Speech Club: A fun opportunity for students to engage in various public speaking events including dramatic reading, duet acting, improvisation, and stand-up comedy to name a few! The team will compete either in the IESA Speech competition and/or a Korae Speech Night. No experience is required and there are no try-outs...all are welcome!

Sign Language Beginners: Students will learn the basics of sign language, including the alphabet, colors, names, and animals. We will also be practicing a song to perform during Sights and Sounds.

Sign Language Intermediate: Students who have taken Sign Language beginners may enroll in this class. Students will learn basic conversational phrases and extend their sign language vocabulary. We will also be practicing a song to perform during Sights and Sounds.

Typing and Coding: Students will practice their typing fluency and computer coding. Students who have been in the club before, will continue with their individualized programs. This is great for students who use Chromebooks in their classroom! Each activity is a separate time slot.

Math Enhancement: Students will be practicing math strategies and skills. Students will be engaging in math collaboratively with hands-on activities and problem solving. Students may also receive homework support.

Reading Enhancement: Students will be practicing reading strategies and skills at their level. Students will be engaging in text and meeting one on one with the teacher about their progress. Homework help will also be available!

Art Club: Art Club provides students with the opportunity to explore creative ideas and talents through projects and collaboration. There is a materials fee with this club.

Battle of the Books: Love to read? Battle of the Books is a voluntary reading program for students in grades 4- 8 (two groups - 6-8 & 4-5). The purpose is simply to encourage students to read good books and have fun while competing with peers. Students will participate in games, discussions and other activities related to the 2020 Rebecca Caudill Titles (6-8) and Blue Stem Titles (4-5). Students will read the award winning books and compete in trivia or Family Feud style questions about those books with an official Battle in the spring against another school.

Youth Choir: Join the Youth Choir for Ss Constantine and Helen Church. Meets in the morning.

Yu-Gi-Oh & Pokemon: Join the beginners circle to learn how to play. Students need to bring their own cards. This is a casual atmosphere and not highly competitive. All students must bring their own cards. All levels welcome.
